We continually seek additional areas of opportunities to promote sustainability across all aspects of our business.

In accordance with these standards, DMI will avoid trading and sourcing fibre from the following categories:

- Illegally harvested wood:
- Wood harvested in violation of traditional or civil rights;
- Wood harvested from forests in which high conservation values are threatened by management activities;
- Wood harvested from areas being converted from forests and other wooded ecosystems to plantations or other non - forest uses;
- Wood from forests in which genetically modified trees are planted:
- Support ILO Core Conventions, as defined in the ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, 1998.
